With *Documents on British Policy Overseas*, researchers gain a more complete understanding of the tensions, motivations, politics, and relationships that shaped Europe and the world throughout the 20th century.

- *British Documents on the Origins of War* (1898-1914), which includes documents related to the Anglo-German tensions leading to the First World War.
- *Documents on British Foreign Policy* (1918-1939), which addresses post-war settlement, re-armament, and growing tensions in Europe, Africa and the Far East.
- *Documents on British Policy Overseas* (1946-), which covers topics such as atomic energy, the Korean Conflict and the Cold War.

Documents on British Policy Overseas is updated regularly with newly selected materials on additional topics, and supports other ProQuest government resources, including *Twentieth Century House of Commons Parliamentary Papers* and *Digital National Security Archive*. Diplomatic historians, international relations scholars, British Studies specialists, war researchers, and educators in many disciplines will find this collection an indispensable resource.

Scholars and others can organise their research by using the "Marked List" feature, which maintains a running list of links to user-selected documents during a search session. They can also use the "My Archive" feature, which allows users to create their own personalised area in *Documents on British Policy Overseas* in which to store saved searches and selected records with notes between sessions. Seamless citation software support makes it easy to generate accurate citations in a variety of formats.

By combining rich content with user-friendly search tools, ProQuest helps today's scholars easily dig beneath the surface to understand the role and inner workings of British diplomacy during the last century.

The *Documents on British Policy Overseas* interface is custom designed to take full advantage of the unique and specialist aspects of this content. Users can search for authors, recipients and place of origin of communications, as well as keywords and titles. They can also restrict their searches by document type as well as date ranges.



Researchers can browse all the content, sort search results by relevance and date, and filter results by collection/volume, document type, author, recipient, place, and date. These capabilities let the researcher focus on content rather than on the mechanics of searching.

Digital National Security Archive (DNSA)

Created in collaboration with the National Security Archive, this database is the most comprehensive collection available of significant primary documents central to U.S. foreign and military policy since 1945.

DNSA contains the most important, declassified documents – more than 600,000 pages over a number of individual collections – that have been gathered through extensive use of the US Freedom of Information Act (FOIA): many are published now for the first time.

Each collection contains a diverse range of policy documents including presidential directives, memos, diplomatic dispatches, meeting notes, independent reports, briefing papers, White House communications, email, confidential letters, and other secret material. Additionally, reference supplements including introductory material, a chronology, a glossary, an essay, and a bibliography provide context and background for each collection. Documents have been selected by leading scholars in each of the topic areas. Each item has been abstracted and indexed over 20 different fields to enable powerful searching.

In its totality, *DNSA* offers the most effective research and teaching tool available in the area of U.S. foreign policy, intelligence, and security issues during this pivotal period of 20th century history and into the 21st century.
